
We will also be re-introducing the Tri-Golf programme which is incorporated in the P.E. curriculum after the Easter break.

For the first time since the 1990s, St.Pius entered a soccer tournament. The SPAR 5-a-side competition took place on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March in Irishtown Stadium. With a squad of just 8 players permitted, trials were held in the school hall for the interested 6<sup>th</sup> class boys. Almost 40 boys turned up so it was a difficult task for Mr. Ryan and Mr Murtagh to whittle it down to just 8, but in the end we were very happy with our panel of players. Our thanks to all the boys who tried out and unfortunately, we couldn't bring everyone, even though the standard of all the boys was excellent!

Having arrived in Irishtown we were drawn in a group of four with only the top team going through to the quarter finals. We won our first game against Dublin 7 Educate Together 9-0 with all the lads playing tremendously and displaying a great range of skills. The next game was a great encounter where again we emerged on top, managing to beat our opposition 6-1. Our final group game was a tight encounter and it finished one all after a great game, during which the Pius boys enjoyed most of the possession and were unlucky not to get the win. Having finished level and with both teams tied on points, it went down to goal difference and our lads went through to the semi-finals with a difference of +4 goals.

The standard in football was extremely high in the semi-final. Pius switched off for a second early in the game and were punished by a run in behind our defense and an excellent goal from our opposing team. However, our lads kept their composure and with all the possession continued to press and control the game. The breakthrough eventually came when we struck the equaliser, a lovely well worked goal. With 2 minutes remaining we grabbed a winner and after excellent defending we hung on to send us through to the final.


